### Reminder

**Any medication, over-the-counter or prescription, must be accompanied by a doctor's or Licensed Health Practitioner's (LHP) signature.**

Medication forms are available in the office, which must be signed by your doctor or LHP and by you. These can be faxed to your doctor's office at your doctor's request. Any prescription medication will only be given if it also is in the original container that identifies the child by name, date of prescription, the date of expiration, and doctor. There must be legible instructions for administration.

Any medication given must be in the original container and the dose and frequency must be stated on the label. It must be age-appropriate for the child. All medications, internal and external (e.g. antihistamines, non-aspirin fever reducers/pain relievers, non-narcotic cough suppressants, cough drops, decongestants and **sunscreen**, ointments) will be stored in a locked container. **DO NOT put these medications in your child's lunch box.** If you wish to bring sunscreen we suggest one of the continuous spray types as they are both easier and faster to apply to children.

## Lunches

For those children who eat lunch at Discovery Montessori, their lunches will be monitored for the daily nutritional requirements. Our daycare regulations state that children's lunches must contain:

- (1) a dairy product (such as milk, cheese, yogurt, or cottage cheese);
- (2) meat or meat alternative (such as beef, fish, poultry, legumes, tofu, or beans);
- (3) a grain product (such as bread, cereal, bagel, or rice cake);
- (4) fruits or vegetables (two fruits or two vegetables or one fruit and one vegetable to equal the total portion size required). When juice is sent in place of a fruit or vegetable it must be 100% fruit or vegetable juice.

Please provide an ice pack for potentially hazardous foods (such as meats, cooked potatoes, cooked legumes, cooked rice, sprouts, cut melons or cantaloupes, milk, or cheese)

For those who eat breakfast at Discovery Montessori, it must contain:

- (1) a fruit or vegetable or 100% fruit or vegetable juice;
- (2) a dairy product (such as milk, cheese, yogurt, or cottage cheese);
- (3) a grain product (such as bread, cereal, rice cake or bagel).

## Snacks

Please check the monthly calendar on the last page. Due to scheduling changes your snack day may have been moved. Your child's name on the monthly calendar indicates your day to provide snack. We may not serve homemade snacks. Fruits and cheeses will be cut and prepared by our staff. If particular items on your list for the scheduled day are not available you may check another day for an appropriate item from that group. For those of you who have children in all day, on your snack day, you will be providing snack for both a.m. and p.m. sessions. Each class has about 20 AM students and 20 PM students.

Kindergarten and Elementary students do not have a scheduled snack time. However, if you would like your child to have a morning snack please send extra food in their lunch box and label the extra food as "snack". Any snacks brought to school should be healthy. Please no candies or other "junk" foods.

## Incidental Daycare

We've had several parents ask about having their child stay for daycare occasionally. We are happy to offer this service to our families. Due to state regulations we need to have a certain number of staff available for daycare. Therefore we are asking that you make arrangements in advance so we are adequately staffed. The fee for Incidental Daycare is \$8 per hour, per student. There is a minimum fee of \$8 per session.

## Show 'n' Tell

For Show 'n' Tell on Friday, please have your child bring one item in a bag with his/her name on it. It should be placed in the show 'n' tell basket as soon as they come on Friday. Since we will be having the show 'n' tell relate to our area of study for the month, please check the calendar for the kind of item the child should bring. Encourage your child to tell you what the item is so that s/he will be able to tell about it in circle. This practice will help with their verbal speaking ability, their vocabulary, and their confidence.

Upper Elementary students do not participate in Show 'n' Tell.

## Friday Folders

In the Kindergarten-2<sup>nd</sup> grade and preschool classes, the children's work for the week will be sent home on Friday in a large manila envelope. In the Upper Elementary the children bring their work home in a clear plastic folder. We encourage you to sit down with your child and go over his/her accomplishments. Please send the folders back on your child's next school day! If your child is young, please be relaxed if s/he has not done work which can be brought home as they do so many activities which do not have papers or products connected with them.

## Book Orders

We'll be sending book orders with your monthly newsletters. You are not obligated to buy these books, but the school does receive free gifts with bonus points we earn from the book orders. With our bonus points we have earned our microwave ovens, our toaster oven and many free books. We try to send the appropriate form for your child's age. We have chosen the Scholastic Book Orders because they generally have good quality books at reasonable prices. You may order online at [scholastic.com](http://scholastic.com). Our class activation code is H3X9Z, and is under Karen Nelson's name.

## Payment

Tuition is due the fifth day of class for the month. We appreciate your promptness as it enables us to devote more time to the growth and education of your child. Payments received after the 5<sup>th</sup> school day of the month will be subject to a \$10.00 late charge unless other arrangements have been made. Please put the student(s) name on your check on the "For" line. This will help us to credit your account accurately.

## Pictures

We have planned to have a photographer come to take individual and class pictures on Friday, October 2nd. We will send an envelope for picture choices and payment with the October newsletter. We have chosen Hudson photography again to take the pictures. They are from Bremerton and we have been happy with their quality and prices.

## Study of the Month

This month we will be concentrating on many of the grace and courtesy exercises such as tucking chairs under the table when finished, walking in the classroom, rolling and putting mats away nicely, putting work away, keeping quiet voices, remembering to say please and thank you, waiting turns, walking behind the children when leaving the circle, entering the classroom quietly if arriving late, etc.

In the **Preschool and Kindergarten classes** the September curriculum emphasis will be grace and courtesy, manners, rules and routines. We will begin introductions of Montessori materials in practical life, sensorial, language and math. History: calendars. We will also begin an introduction of year-long emphasis on historical tradition through Nursery Rhymes and Stories. Art: rain paintings, weather scenes with textured paper, weaving--sun plates, paint and color rainbows, cloud art, mobiles, and collages. Cultural: Science--Study of the weather, clouds, rain, sun, thermometers, rain gauge, rainbow, and the water cycle, Video on Galileo (K-6). Cooking: Awesome Apple Tree, Bologna Rolls, Camera Cookie, and Deviled Eggs. Show 'n' Tell: Items that begin with a, b, c, and d sounds. Spanish. Music and Movement: "Adorable," "A-Hunting We Will Go," "A-Ring Around the Rosy," "Baa, Baa Black Sheep," "Clementine," "Colors," "Down by the Station," "Raining Cats and Dogs," "We are a Rainbow," "If I See My Shadow," and "Lightning likes me."

In the **Elementary class** the children will be learning: Beginning introductions or reintroducing of Montessori materials in practical life, sensorial, language, and math. Grace and courtesy, manners, rules and routines. Cultural: Science—study of earth's atmosphere, weather. Social Studies: Study of early indigenous people of North America and early North American explorers. Music Appreciation: Geology Rocks Musical. Art Appreciation: Peace in Art Education, Pacific Northwest Native Art. Technology: Keyboarding.

## Pick Up and Drop Off Procedure

We have changed over to electronic sign in. Each responsible adult will have a pin number with which to sign their child in and out. The pads for the sign in and out will be located inside each classroom. This process requires internet access, so the pads are not portable to the outside areas. If you have not received a pin number, please see your child's teacher or Ms. Valerie in the office. **Please sign your child in upon arrival and out upon departure using the pads located**

**by the doors. The pin number you are given is used in lieu of your full legal signature.**

Students are not allowed to sign themselves in or out. Please do not leave siblings or other children in your care unsupervised in your vehicle, outside or in the classroom while you are picking up/dropping off your student. If you come through the gate by the playground, please make sure you close it behind you. If you pick up your child at recess, you **must tell the playground teachers.** For after school daycare, we will be separating the preschool and kindergarten children from the 1st-8th grade children from 3:00-4:30. For the first hour preschool and kindergarten children will generally be on the playground and the older children will be in one of the larger rooms in the building or on the playfield. We are waiting to see when the regular pick-up times are for the children so we can make it convenient for you to retrieve your children in a timely manner. Thank you for your cooperation in these matters as it helps ensure the safety of all the children. Children not scheduled for daycare are to be picked up later than 10 minutes after class. If they are not picked up within the 10 minutes your account will be charged an incidental daycare fee of \$8 for the first 10-60 minutes and \$8 for each additional hour. If your child is picked up after closing time (5:30) a \$25 fee will be charged.

### **Ongoing Fundraisers**

We have a couple of fundraisers that are ongoing. The first is Friday Lunches and the second is Kids Night Out/Date Night. They help with lowering costs, especially on field trips.

Friday Lunches:

Every Friday we offer a hot lunch provided by Subway, A&W and Dominos. The cost is \$5.00 per lunch. (Subway offers a bigger sandwich, 6in for \$6.00 instead of the 4in for \$5.00 please write on the order if you would like your child to have a bigger sandwich.) The money goes into a separate account so please do not pay for this with your tuition payment. Checks are still made to Discovery Montessori.

Kids Night Out/Date Night:

About once a month, starting in October, we have a kid's night out. We have it at the school on the weekend from 6-10pm. The cost is \$20.00 for a single child, \$30.00 for up to 3 children and \$40.00 for 4 or more children. It is run by Mrs. Valerie Nelson.
